It is for this reason that I have been heartened by some recent very good responses we have had to recruitment drives in a number of parishes. While the last two years

Emerging from two years of uncertainty, 2022 has been a year of hope and opportunity for our ministry.

W e started as the previous year concluded, with mask and vaccination requirements, separation of cohorts in schools, and maintaining physical distancing indoors. Most meetings and the Level 1 Catechist Course continued to be Zoom based, which resulted in more SRE Coordinators and Catechists being able to attend but without the gaiety that gathering in person brings. With the resumption of in-person training and meetings, we retained the option to join via Zoom to remove barriers from attending events and can attest that our Level 2 and 3 courses this year were attended by SRE Catechists and Parishioners, from all reaches of our diocese and beyond.

Embracing the benefits of technology, this year also saw the introduction of our monthly CatechistNET Newsletter, which is now emailed out to all SRE Catechists and Parishes. The newsletter was introduced to share information promptly and more frequently than we could when printing and mailing three CatechistNET magazines per year.

Significantly, in 2022 we simplified our process of authorising new SRE Catechists with a shift from the 5-year Teacher Engagement Form (TEF) to an ongoing TEF that only needs to be renewed if there is a change of parish priest/administrator or change of role (from helper to teacher, etc). The new process now includes a compulsory "conversation" for all new SRE Catechists to have with the parish priest/administrator, so that the volunteer service agreement is understood and that being an SRE Catechist is a good fit for the volunteer.

In May, the Diocese of Wollongong hosted the Catholic Conference of Religious Educators in State Schools (CCRESS) conference at the Mount Carmel Retreat Centre, Varroville. It was attended by leaders of CCD from NSW and the ACT, who gathered to address key challenges and opportunities facing the ministry, including ideas pertinent to recruitment, and flexible models for the delivery of SRE.

In June, Peter Gilmore, who has been a leader in CCD Wollongong for more than a decade, moved from CCD into the role of Coordinator of Evangelisation and Parish Renewal for our diocese. Peter sits next to me in the office and remains supportive of SRE in schools and the evangelising work of SRE teachers and helpers in our parishes. In July, we were blessed with an addition to our CCD team with Daniel Saliba joining us as Faith Education Officer for the diocese. Fortuitously, Daniel's first day of work coincided with the Macarthur-Highlands Catechist Coordinators meeting at the Campbelltown Catholic Club (CCC). Daniel has already shown to be an asset to our Diocesan CCD team, with much enthusiasm for SRE and a deep knowledge of our Catholic faith.

In September, our annual Catechist retreat was held at the Mount Carmel Retreat Centre, Varroville and St Mary's Star of the Sea, Gerringong. We are grateful to Sr Magdalen Mather OSB for facilitating these special days of prayer and rest. We increased the length of the retreat day this year, to maximise the experience for those attending.

In November, we enjoyed the Annual Catechist Mass and Awards at our Cathedral in large numbers and were able to celebrate with a generous luncheon afterwards for the first time in three years! Thank you to all those who joined us for the important and uplifting celebration.

A special thank you must go to the CCC who came to our aid this year when Micah House was unavailable, allowing us to use conference rooms for Coordinator meetings and Catechist courses in Campbelltown. The CCC is a large supporter of the faith education of Catholic students and increased funding to CCD in 2022, which allowed for the Christ Our Light and Life (COLAL) online resources, recruitment material and the expansion of the Campbelltown Resource Centre. The CCC has further increased funding to CCD for 2023, so that we can achieve our aim for the year, which is to build our ministry through recruitment and training along with further development of the Resource Centre.

In preparation for 2023, and with a focus on recruiting for SRE Catechists and promoting SRE in our community, we have developed Kindergarten enrolment brochures for school expos, open days, and Kindergarten enrolment packs, and "Answer the call to Mission" brochures for drumming up support and volunteers in our parishes.

We are pleased to share with you our CCD Calendar for 2023 in the centre of this magazine. In keeping with our focus on recruitment and training new volunteers, the Level 1 course will run twice next year, in Terms 1 and 3. The Catechist Retreat will be in May, during Eastertide, and we have planned a short half-day course on Understanding Aboriginal Catholic Spirituality, in three locations: Nowra, Campbelltown and Wollongong. The short course will be run by experts from the Catholic Education Office and is a great opportunity for us to learn about Aboriginal culture and spiritualities to aid us as Catholic educators. I will be the first in line for the course as I've had very little training in Aboriginal cultural studies and have become aware that there are more Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children in State Schools than in our Catholic Schools. ■

CELEBRATING THE VALUE OF SPECIAL RELIGIOUS EDUCATION IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

O n Monday 28th November, Bishop Brian Mascord, members of the Diocesan CCD team and a group of Wollongong SRE teachers gathered at NSW Parliament House for this year's Celebration of SRE. We joined with 450 people from across all faith traditions to expound the importance of giving parents choice for formation in the faith of their family, with all of its benefits, especially highlighting the way SRE promotes wellbeing and cohesiveness in our society.

The Hon. Sarah Mitchell, Minister for Education and Early Learning, outlined the current State Government's unequivocal support for SRE, affirmation of the work of approved providers and volunteers, and commitment to fixing ongoing issues with the enrolment form.

Similarly, Ms Prue Car, the Deputy Opposition Leader and Shadow Minister for Education, advocated for the very valuable place of SRE in schools and committed to ensuring the enrolment form is fixed to again include both an SRE and a religious identity question to best support and cater for families of faith in public schools.

Bishop Mascord, in giving a vote of thanks to the Education Minister, noted the significant financial and human resources poured into providing quality SRE by the Catholic Church and other faith groups. Importantly, he highlighted that formation in faith unarguably correlates with numerous indicators of wellbeing, and must be a strong and continuing priority for politicians and educators if they truly want what is best for young people.

A number of awards were presented to SRE teachers as part of the gathering and overall the event powerfully affirmed the value of the work you do in NSW, with SRE teachers being the second biggest volunteer force in Australia!

THE RELEVANCE OF SRE: FINDING IDENTITY IN

Almost 60 years ago Pope St Paul VI affirmed the right of Christian children to receive a specifically Christian education:

S ince all Christians have become by rebirth of water and the Holy Spirit a new creature so that they should be called and should be children of God, they have a right to a Christian education." (Pope St Paul VI, *Gravissimum Educationis*, 2)

The ability to teach Catholic children the faith is not seen by the Church as a privilege, but a right. We are presently fortunate enough to have the law uphold this right in NSW, at least as it pertains to the Special Religious Education of Catholic children in state schools.

Currently SRE has bipartisan support within the NSW Parliament. While there are many in the political sphere who are ideologically motivated to simply remove any provision for SRE in legislation, the greatest challenge to SRE continues to be an internal one. Across NSW, diocese after diocese is thinking of new ways to find volunteers to teach the Catholic faith to students in state schools. This has particularly been a struggle since the COVID- 19 pandemic. However, the need for SRE Catechists has seldom been greater.

The move from childhood into adolescence has never been so



difficult. Struggles with self-esteem and bullying continue to be a problem for young people, with Australia unfortunately reporting one of the highest global rates of bullying in schools. In Australia approximately 13.6% of children aged 4-11 are experiencing a mental health disorder and recent data from the United Kingdom indicates that the incidence of mental illness within this cohort is increasing. This is due to a variety of causes, but it stands to reason that with the societal drift away from God, individuals without faith are forced to artificially create identity and meaning for their lives.

Catholic SRE provides an elementary foundation for young children to view the world through the teachings of Christ and the Church. Living in the Third century metropolis of Alexandria, surrounded by many conflicting and hostile views to the Christian faith, St Clement of Alexandria, himself a catechist and head of the first catechetical school is a witness to the perennial approach of the Church to the catechesis of children. According to him "The primary lesson for life must be implanted in the soul from the earliest age. The primary lesson for children is to know the eternal God, the One Who gives everlasting life."

Catholic SRE teaches children that a world made by a loving God is intentional, purposeful and dignified. This provides a platform for children to help find meaning in their lives prior to entering adolescence with all of its challenges. In a Catholic SRE classroom, children are taught that they are loved unconditionally, that there is a purpose for their life, and making the right choices ultimately creates a better world for them and those around them. Children learn that God created them intentionally, body and soul as boys and girls with unique gifts. Finally, that they are image bearers of Christ and were created to grow in his likeness ultimately finding their identity in Him.



L aunching on January 1, 2023 is *The Catechism in a Year* podcast, featuring Fr Mike Schmitz who also presents the very popular, *The Bible in a Year* podcast. Fr Mike serves as Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministry for the Diocese of Duluth and as Chaplain for the Newman Catholic Campus Ministry at the University of Minnesota-Duluth. He has a warm and jovial character and is entertaining to listen to. I recommend visiting the Ascension Presents YouTube channel, to view one of Fr Mike's weekly videos where he reflects on faith, pop culture and the latest news.

Fr Mike will read from the second edition of the Catechism of the Catholic Church with the revision to paragraph 2267 by Pope Francis. Each day in the short podcast, Fr Mike will highlight key concepts, explaining the context, and showing how to live out the teachings of the Catholic Faith in daily life. I encourage you to sign up and get involved by listening to the podcast while you go about your daily tasks. I listen to podcasts while I drive, but you might prefer to listen as you garden or do the dishes!

Next year, CCD Wollongong will host online gatherings to discuss the content of the Catechism, which will be open to all those in our diocese who are listening to the podcast.

W hile the Resource Centre has been closed due to the installation of a new air conditioning system, the Office of Renewal and Evangelisation Team (ORE), under the guidance of Jude Hennessy, has been thinking of new ways the centre could be used in its full capacity going forward.

One thing which we are all very excited about is that the purpose of the Resource Centre is expanding and will be open to all members of the community, where they will be free to study and borrow resources for their own faith formation. As part of this expansion, the centre will likely also include an office for the Youth Ministry in the region.

It has also been decided that we will have a Blessed Sacrament chapel in the same space. The chapel will be open to members of the community during the opening hours of the Resource Centre. Eucharistic adoration nights could potentially be held. As mentioned in previous newsletters, the new resource centre is large enough to hold Catechist retreats, youth events, and courses as well as other events for Evangelisation and Renewal within the diocese.

The CCD team have also been looking at a new library system which will make it easier to search, borrow and return resources. Going forward, we will be using a platform called 'Libib.' This system is much newer, very user-friendly and more efficient than the current system. Since Libib is an online system, it will allow catechists and members of the community to search for resources in our centre from the comfort of their home before borrowing them in the centre. For those outside the Macarthur region, the new library system will allow orders to be made by simply browsing the catalogue and contacting Cindy Oliver, our resource centre manager. This will make the centre a resource hub for the whole diocese.

While we continue looking forward to the reopening of the centre before the end of the year, we ask for your prayers that everything remains on course and according to plan.
